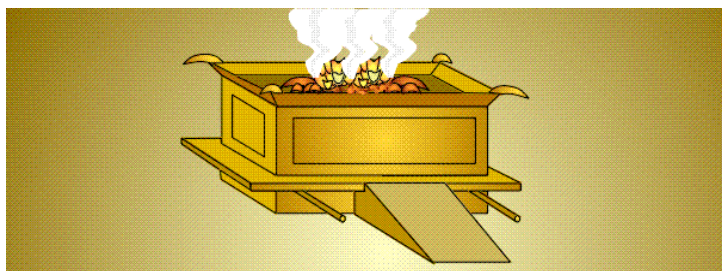
After the Day of Atonement, the Israelites could bring their sacrifices into to the Court.
