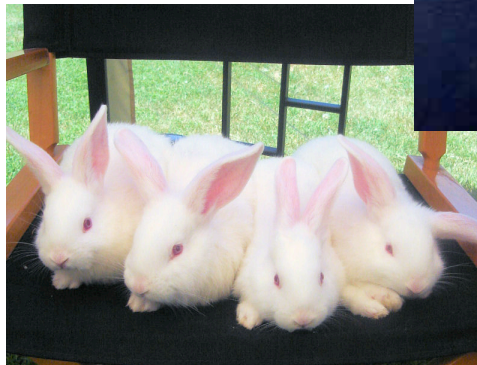

Easter was a pagan celebration of the rebirth of life in the spring—adopted by Christians by the Fourth Century.

Because she was supposed to help people have lots of children, she was worshipped with eggs, which would be painted—then buried or burned as an offering to her. People also used lots of bunnies in her worship.
